

II.

CREED AND COVENANT.

"Hold fast the form of sound words,"—2 Tim. ii. 13.

[The names of the candidates having been read they shall take their places before the pulpit.]

CONFESSION OF FAITH.

In the presence of Almighty God, the searcher of hearts, and before this assembly, you profess your unfeigned belief of the Holy Scriptures, as given by divine inspiration; your acceptance of all the doctrines contained in them; and your submission to the whole will of God as revealed in them.

Particularly, you believe that the Lord Jehovah, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, is the one Only Living and True God; that the Lord Jesus Christ is the Son of God, equal with the Father and the only Savior of men; that the Holy Ghost is also God, and that he is the only Sanctifier of those who believe in Christ to the salvation of their souls.

You also believe, that in consequence of the fall of man from his primitive state of innocence, all the human race, while in a state of nature are destitute of holiness; and that a renovation of heart, during the present life, through sanctification of the Spirit of God, is necessary to fit mankind for union and communion with the visible Church of Christ on earth, and for an entrance into the kingdom of heaven.

You furthermore believe, that all who are the subjects of the renewing and sanctifying influences of the Holy Spirit, exercise supreme love to God, benevolence towards men, repentance of sin, and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose righteousness forms the only ground of justification before God; and that the law of God still remains the rule of their conduct.

Thus you profess your assent to the articles of our faith.

BAPTISM.

You who in childhood were admitted by baptism to a place in

the covenant of God do now, of your own accord, assume its full obligations and privileges, and

To you who have had no part by baptism among the people of God we do now apply the seal of the covenant.

Covenant.

Humbly hoping that you are a subject of the new birth, of that faith in Christ which works by love and purifies the heart, and of that repentance which is unto life, you avouch the Lord Jehovah to be your God, Jesus Christ to be your Savior, and the Holy Spirit to be your Sanctifier.

Depending on Divine grace for sanctification, consolation, and spiritual strength, and receiving the word of God as the only rule of your faith and practice, you submit to the brotherly watch and discipline of this Church of Christ; and engage on your part to comfort, assist, and if need be, admonish and reprove its members as becometh a faithful follower of Jesus.

You do now solemnly give up yourself and all that you have, unto God: promising that you will endeavor to walk as becometh the Gospel of Christ: that you may give no cause for others to speak evil of it on your account, but that the name of God may be glorified in you. Thus you covenant and promise to do, depending on, and seeking for grace and strength from God, through our Lord Jesus Christ.

[The candidate will assent by bowing.]

ON THE PART OF THE CHURCH.

[Members of the Church will here rise.]

We then, as a Church, do cordially receive you to our communion and fellowship, giving thanks to God, who we trust has inclined you by his Spirit thus to dedicate yourself to him. We covenant to love you with all Christian affection, and to care for and watch over you with all Christian fidelity and tenderness; treating you as a member with us of the body of Christ, who is Head over all things to his Church. And may the Lord bless you and keep you; give you strength for every conflict, and grace for every good word and work. And may God of his infinite mercy grant, that we may so be faithful to each other, and to him, that at last we may all come to that blessed Church above, where love shall be forever perfect, and joy forever full.

III.

QUESTIONS FOR SELF-EXAMINATION.

"Examine yourselves whether ye be in the faith."—*2 Cor. xiii:5.*

1. What *opinions* do I adopt, and habitually defend and inculcate? Are they in accordance with the Bible and with my profession as a Christian?
2. What is the prevailing tenor of my conversation? Is it spiritual or worldly?—trifling or serious? And what influence has my example on my friends or acquaintances? Is it holy or unholy?—such as tends to save or destroy?
3. How far am I influenced by the opinions, the customs and the fashions of the world? And as to all that is sinful or injurious in these, do I prayerfully endeavor to "come out of the world and be separate?"
4. Do I study the Bible? Do I understand and truly prize its glorious *doctrines*? Do its *precepts* regulate all my intercourse with men, and my communion with God?
5. Am I faithful to the duty of *secret prayer*? How often, and with what spirit do I engage in it? And do I find myself comforted, strengthened, and profited by it? And do I grow in the love of it?
6. How do I spend the *Sabbath*? Do I esteem it a delight, holy of the Lord, honorable? Do I endeavor not to waste or misimprove any part of it in indolence, or worldly conversation, or in unimportant and useless matters, but seriously to occupy it with thoughts of God, and truth, and duty, and salvation?
7. Do I strive, at all times, to act from fixed regard to the *glory of God*—to resist and overcome sin? And when I pray for knowledge, zeal, self-denial, holiness, usefulness, am I willing that my prayer should be answered? And do I prove this by my diligent use of the means for the attainment of these blessings?
8. What are my feelings towards the *Church*? Do I pray at all times for a blessing on its officers, its members, and to attend its means of grace? And am I so faithful to all its ordinances and services, and do I personally so live, that if all were to imitate my example, it would be eminently a spiritual, and holy, and useful Church?
9. Do I, in dependence on the Holy Spirit, govern my tem-

per, subdue my passions, control my tongue, and put away everything like a spirit of complaining or fault finding with my brethren or others? Am I of a meek, forgiving, forbearing, humble spirit? And does the law of kindness dwell on my lips?

10. If a parent, are my children dedicated to God in baptism, instructed in divine truth, commended to God in prayer, educated, both by precept and example, for heaven? And do I make it a matter of conscience, never to allow them in any place, or amusement, or pleasure, or plan of business, on which I cannot ask God's blessing?

11. Do I habitually regard myself as the *steward* and *servant* of Christ, and esteem it a privilege and pleasure, rather than a grief, to be asked to contribute, and to do all in my power for the advancement of his kingdom?

12. What proportion of my property do I devote to the support and extension of the gospel, at home and abroad? In what do I deny myself for the purpose of doing good? To how many of the poor and destitute, and afflicted, will the Savior point in the last day, and say to me, "Inasmuch as ye did that deed of charity to one of these, ye did it unto me?"

13. Do I truly care for the souls of the impenitent and perishing, whether about me, or in distant and heathen lands, and do I earnestly pray for them, and do all that lies in my power that they may be brought to Christ?

14. Am I interested in the Prayer Meetings and Lectures—in the Monthly Concerts and the Sabbath School? And do I sustain them by my presence, my influence, my heavenly mindedness?

15. Do I realize that I am *to live but once*, that the character I form here, whether holy or sinful, will be mine forever, and that the influence I am now exerting, will be felt when I have passed into eternity?

16. Do I live as though I had indeed been redeemed with the blood of Christ, and had given myself entirely to his service? And is my heartfelt wish and prayer, in sickness or health, joy or sorrow, life or death,—"Thy will, O God, be done?"

17. Will you often read and ponder these questions—praying God to search your heart and life as to the various duties which they suggest and to aid you by his Spirit to grow in grace, and to be more and more useful, faithful and holy, even to the end of life?

IV.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

"That thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God,
which is the Church of the living God."—*Tim. iii: 15.*

This Church recognizes the two great principles of Congregationalism: 1st, Local Self-government. 2d, Fellowship of the Churches. Under these it gladly seeks to walk and work with all other denominations who accept Christ for their head.

BUSINESS MEETINGS.

The Annual Meeting of the Church shall be held some time during the month of April.

OFFICERS.

The officers of the Church are the Pastor, Deacons, Clerk, Treasurer and Standing Committee.

The Clerk, besides his other duties, is expected to report at the Annual Meeting a complete list of the Charities of the Church and Sunday School.

The Standing Committee consists of the Pastor, Deacons, and three Brethren, the latter to be chosen at the Annual Meeting and to be eligible only for one year. The distinctive title of these three brethren is the "Church Committee." In addition to them three ladies shall be chosen for one year, at the same time, to render aid in things temporal and spiritual to the needy sisters of the Church.

The Standing Committee and the three ladies aforesaid shall meet in the Church parlor on the Monday evening after the first Sunday of the month, to make appropriations for the poor of the Church.

ADMISSION OF MEMBERS.

Members are received into this Church either on the confession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, or by letters of commendation from other evangelical churches.

Candidates for admission to the Church on their confession of

faith will meet the Standing Committee, and if their doctrinal belief and religious experience are deemed satisfactory, shall be propounded publicly on the Sabbath. Two weeks later, if no objection is made, they may be received as members according to the usual form. Persons who bring letters or certificates from other evangelical churches, after approval by the same Committee, must have the letter or certificate read on the Sabbath and, if no objection is made, after two weeks are considered members.

Members of other evangelical churches wishing to commune with this Church for more than one year are expected, except for satisfactory counter reasons given to the pastor, to bring their letters and enter into formal relations with us.

DISMISSAL OF MEMBERS.

Members of this Church may be dismissed to other churches by the public statement on the Sabbath of their request, and the consequent granting of a letter two weeks later, provided there has been meantime no objection thereto. Such letter is, however, in force only one year from date.

Members of this Church who remove their residence from this place to the vicinity of some Church in fellowship with us, are expected to take letters of dismissal and recommendation to such Church within one year, if practicable.

If any member of this Church shall, without satisfactory reasons, be absent from the city or from the communion more than one year, the name of such person may, by a vote of the Standing Committee, be stricken from the roll of Church Members as violating the Rules and Covenant of the Church, and in case of such action, notice shall be given to the person so stricken from the list of Church Members.

DISCIPLINE.

1. Where an offense is personal and private and denied by the offender, the person offended may labor with the offender alone but cannot bring him before the Church.

2. All personal and other offenses shall be prosecuted according to the directions of Christ in Matthew xviii, excepting public

scandals, in case of which the preliminary steps there named may be observed or omitted at the option of the complainant.

3. All complaints to the Church shall be presented to the moderator in writing and shall state distinctly the offenses charged and that it can be proved by the proper number of witnesses, and also that the previous steps have been taken (when required) as above, and that the offending person has given no satisfaction.

4. In relation to previous steps an exception will arise where the residence of the offender is unknown or so distant as to make it difficult to communicate with him. Every such complaint shall be laid before the Church without delay, and no member, against whom a complaint has been thus made, shall be considered in good standing or entitled to the privileges of the Church till such complaint is finally disposed of by the Church.

5. At the meeting when the complaint is received the Church shall proceed no further, except by consent of parties, than to order the accused to be furnished with a copy of the charges, and that all persons interested, including the witnesses, be served with citations to appear at the future meeting of the Church. The Church may, however, dispense with this rule by their vote where the residence of the accused is unknown, or when there is no reason to expect his appearance, and may even at once proceed to final action.

6. Any member of the Church neglecting to obey a citation as above shall be cited a second time, and if he continues to disobey it may be suspended or excluded from the communion of the Church as disregarding its authority and violating his covenant engagements.

7. Any accused member found guilty of an offense, and not making satisfactory confession, shall be admonished or suspended from Church privileges until he gives satisfactory evidence of repentance, or may be excommunicated from the Church, as the case may require. Such member, however, may, upon proper confession of his faith made to the Church in writing and accompanied with satisfactory evidence of repentance, be restored to fellowship, such confession to be read before the Church, and in cases where the Church shall deem best also before the congregation.

V.

CHRISTIAN WORSHIP AND WORK.

"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together."—Hebrew xii. 25.

SUNDAY SERVICES.

1. Public Worship on the Lord's Day at 10.45 A. M., and P. M. at 7.15 Winters and 7.45 Summers.
2. Church Sunday School at 9.15 A. M., immediately preceding morning service.
3. Bradley Street Mission School at 2 P. M.
4. East New London Mission School at 1½ P. M.

SACRAMENTS.

1. The Lord's Supper is administered the first Sunday of every alternate month, beginning with January. Preparatory lecture in the Chapel the Friday evening preceding the Sacrament. All who love the Lord Jesus Christ and have been baptized in His name are cordially welcome to the Lord's table.—baptized children of course being expected first to connect themselves with the Church by confession of faith.
2. The Sacrament of Baptism for the children of believing parents connected with the Church will be administered generally on the first Sunday of April, and of every other alternate month when desired. The baptism of adults will be administered between their public confession of faith and their public covenant with the Church on the Communion Sunday when they are received.

WEEK NIGHT SERVICES.

1. The Young People's meeting, during a part or the whole of the year, is held at 8 P. M. Wednesday.
2. The Church Prayer and Conference meeting is held every Friday evening in the Chapel. That on the Friday following the first Sunday of each month is devoted to prayer for the "conversion of the world."
3. The Teachers' meeting is held Friday evening after the Church prayer meeting.

4. The East New London preaching service is held Thursday evening in the Chapel now belonging to the Young Men's Christian Association.

ANNUAL MEETINGS.

1. The annual meeting of the Sunday School occurs early in January.
2. The annual meeting of the Church occurs in April.
3. The annual meeting of the Ecclesiastical Society occurs in April.
4. The annual renting of Slips occurs in April.

SOCIETIES.

1. The "Doreas Society," in behalf of Home Missions, meets Thursday afternoons, once a week.
2. The "Woman's Foreign Missionary Society" meets Saturdays, once a month.
3. The "Schauffler Society" of young ladies meets at private houses on Friday afternoons, from October to May.

CHARITIES.

As at present arranged there are offerings received in Church for the following causes:

VI.

HISTORICAL SKETCH OF THE SECOND CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

"Walk about Zion, and go round about her : tell the towers thereof."—Psalms lxxviii: 12.

FOUNDING.

The Second Congregational Church, of New London, is a daughter of the First Church of Christ, in the same city. With the hearty good wishes of the pastor, Rev. Abel McEwen, D. D., the colony went out to be constituted into a church Tuesday, April 28th, 1835. The confession of faith and covenant in use by the parent church had been previously adopted April 21st, by nineteen persons. During the repairs of the First Church the mother worshipped for six months in her daughter's new house. This stood on the corner of Jay and Huntington streets, and was completed August 3d, 1834. Thursday, April 23d, 1835, this house was formally dedicated to God. The Rev. E. W. Baldwin, D. D., afterwards president of Wabash College, preached the sermon from the text: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ : for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth." The dedicatory prayer was offered by the Rev. Abel McEwen, D. D. The concluding prayer was pronounced by the venerable Dr. Samuel Nott, of Franklin. On the evening of this impressive day—which but one of the original members is alive among us to recall—Henry C. Smith and Charles Butler were elected deacons and ordained thereto with prayer by Rev. Edward Bull. The following Sunday, April 26th, the first service of the new congregation was held in the new temple. The Rev. Joseph Hurlbut preached in the morning from the text, "Who is sufficient for these things." In the afternoon the Rev. Daniel Huntington followed with a ser-

mon based on the Scripture, "Take heed how ye hear." The same day a Sunday School, with fifteen teachers and forty-two scholars, was organized under the superintendency of Thomas S. Perkins. The first celebration of the Lord's Supper took place on the first Sunday in June, 1835, and was made precious by the confession of Christ of the late Henry P. Haven and of the wife of our Senior Deacon, Dr. Isaac G. Porter.

Thus inaugurated and in co-operation with an Ecclesiastical Society, constituted April 14th, at the house of one of the original members, Hon. T. W. Williams, the Second Congregational Church began her life with the benediction of God.

TEACHERS AND PASTORS.

"And I will give you Pastors according to mine heart."—Jer. iii: 15.

The Rev. Joseph Hurlbut preached and administered the ordinances till a *stated pastor* could be obtained. This was about two years, till March 6th, 1837. His labors were gratuitous. They were marked by the ingathering of one hundred and thirteen members. Mr. H. had also borne one-quarter of the expense of building the first house of worship. He prayed at the last Sacrament in the new house before his death, which occurred suddenly June 5th, 1875.

The Rev. Daniel Huntington, though never an acting pastor like Mr. Hurlbut, was for a number of months acting preacher in the third Sunday service. He led the service of song. He baptized five out of forty-eight children of the Church. His long ministries at Bridgewater, Mass., before and after this date are written on earth. May we not believe that his briefer and unofficial work here where he died is written in Heaven? Almost his last words before his death, May 21, 1858, were, "let me go for the morning breaketh."

The Rev. James M. Macdonald, D. D., became now the first installed pastor of the Second Congregational Church, December 13, 1837. He came from the Third Church of our order in Berlin. The public exercises at his installation included a sermon by Rev. H. Bushnell, D. D., of Hartford; installing prayer by Rev. Mr.

Tuttle, of Groton. He drew in forty-three members to the fold. He was conservative on slavery and temperance and his health suffered from the collision with more radical views. At his own request he was dismissed by a council, January 7, 1840. Dr. M. died in the harness as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, Princeton, April 19, 1876. Drs. Hodge and Duryea conducted the service at the Church; Dr. Atwater at the grave. The latter's funeral sermon from the text "he was a burning and shining light" is calculated to inspire gratitude from this Church for God's early gift to us through him.

The Rev. Artemas Boies was the second pastor installed, March 10, 1841. The installing prayer was pronounced by Rev. Timothy Tuttle, Ledyard, the moderator. Mr. B. had been in delicate health from childhood, yet there was nothing of sombreness in his pastoral zeal. His alertness of wit and affectionateness of manner made him a favorite among the young. During three and one half years he added to the Church one hundred and four members. These all revered him for his goodness. In his last sickness he thought and prayed much for his flock. One moment the glory of God in redemption was uppermost in his mind. The next he could only cry "The Church—when will the Church awake." He passed away, amid the tears of a wife and seven children, September 25th, 1844. The parish raised a monument to his memory bearing the inscription "Speaking the truth in love." The poet-historian of New London voiced, doubtless, the general lamentation in the verse:

"Friend, Pastor, Brother—we
Trace o'er thy life's bright line
And cry, oh may we live like thee;
And be our end like thine."

The Rev. Tryon Edwards, D. D., was the third pastor settled by this Church. This was March 6th, 1845. At the public services of installation the Rev. Joel Hawes, D. D., of Hartford, preached the sermon and Dr. Thomas Bond, of Norwich, gave the right hand of fellowship. Dr. Edwards was dismissed, at his own request August 4th, 1857. His was the longest pastorate in the Church's brief history.

Dr. Edwards baptized thirty-seven children and received two hundred and one members. He exerted and still exerts an influence in the line of his learned and pious ancestry with the pen of authorship no less than the voice of preaching.

Rev. G. Buckingham Wilcox succeeded to the pastorate April 20th, 1859. Rev. Edwards A. Park, D. D., preached the sermon before the council; Dr. McEwen was moderator. The charge to the pastor was by Rev. William H. Wilcox, of Reading, Mass. The right hand of fellowship was by Rev. T. P. Field, D. D., of the First Church. The charge to the people was given by Rev. Dr. J. P. Gulliver, of Norwich.

Mr. Wilcox baptized twenty-nine children and gathered two hundred and seven members in his indefatigable pastorate of ten years and seven months.

He established the Bradley Street Mission September 2d, 1859. He laid the corner-stone of the new Church, October 28th, 1868. November 23d, 1869, at his own request, he was dismissed to accept a call to the First Congregational Church in Jersey City.

The Rev. Oliver Ellsworth Daggett, D. D., became the fifth pastor of this Church, being installed by council February 21st, 1871. The sermon was preached by Rev. S. G. Buckingham, D. D., of Springfield, Mass. The installation prayer was by Rev. Thomas L. Shipman, of Jewett City. A responsive reading from Psalm xlviij and Isaiah lii, was given by Rev. Thomas M. Boss, of Putnam, and the Sunday School and congregation.

In his edifying and acceptable pastorate of nearly seven years Dr. Daggett baptized twenty-six children and received one hundred and fifty-five members. On May 25th, 1875, he preached a sermon reviewing the first forty years of the Church from the text, "Then Samuel took a stone and set it between Mizpeh and Shen and called the name of it Ebenezer saying, 'hitherto hath the Lord helped us.'" To this admirable discourse the compiler of the present notice is largely indebted. Dr. D. was dismissed, at his own request, September 5th, 1877, by a saddened and reluctant council of the neighboring ministry and laity.

The Rev. John Phelps Taylor became the sixth and present pastor of this Church by installation of a council met May 29th,

1878. The sermon was preached from 2 Timothy ii: 24, by Rev. A. J. F. Behrends, D. D., of Providence, R. I., and the installing prayer offered by Rev. William S. Palmer, of Norwich. Rev. A. W. Hazen, of Middletown, gave the charge to the pastor, and Rev. Edward Woolsey Bacon, of the First Church of Christ, the right hand of fellowship.

DEACONS.

"They that have used the office of Deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree."—1 Timothy iii: 13.

The two original Deacons of the Church already mentioned are fallen asleep. Of these:

Henry C. Smith died October 31st, 1865.
Charles Butler, died March 13th, 1878.
Robert Coit, elected December 29th, 1841, died October 18th, 1874.

Henry P. Haven, elected June 7th, 1857, died April 30th, 1876.

Still surviving and in active usefulness are:
Dr. Isaac G. Porter, elected June 7th, 1857.
William H. Chapman, elected May 28th, 1875.
Edmund B. Jennings, elected May 28th, 1875.
William M. Tobey, elected April 26th, 1878.

ECCLESIASTICAL SOCIETY.

"Providing for honest things, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men."—2 Cor. viii: 21.

The Second Ecclesiastical Society was organized April 14th, 1835. From the first it has co-operated efficiently and harmoniously with the Church it was designed to aid. The current expenses of the Society are met by the rental of the Slips. In the building of two houses of worship within less than forty years the Society's Committee have been sorely taxed in resources of purse and of spirit. But they have risen to the occasion with an enterprise and liberality worthy of all praise. The care of the music has

rested on them, and the past year has been intrusted to William D. Brown, organist.

The Society's Committee, for the year ending April, 1880, has already been named.

SUNDAY SCHOOL.

"Gather the people together, men, women and children"—Deut. xxix: 12.

The School has had four Superintendents. Of these Major Thomas S. Perkins was the first. By his kindness and aptness, and a certain moral and spiritual magnetism, he endeared himself to old and young. But his health did not long permit him to discharge the responsible duties of his post. In 1838 he resigned. October 14th, 1843, on a voyage in quest of physical restoration, he died. He was the first of the original founders called away from earth.

Rev. Joseph Hurlbut succeeded him. He utilized his acquaintance with the congregation, gained as acting pastor, for the welfare of the school. Under him the interests of courtesy, of temperance, of brotherly love, of youthful piety, steadily rose and spread among teachers and pupils. His administration lasted twenty years.

Deacon Henry P. Haven next became Superintendent, and continued such from 1858 till his sudden death on Sunday morning, April 30th, 1876. Already he had been in charge of a country school over twenty years. His experience bore rare fruit now in the city. At his wish the hour of meeting was changed to 9 A. M. The school began to enjoy printed programmes, responsive readings, a uniform lesson, and a teachers' meeting. "The Sunday School," he often said, "made me." If so, he proved his gratitude by the perseverance and method, the tact and originality, the contagious love of God's word with which he directed the Sunday School. He prepared a Hymn Book for it. He instituted a Christmas offering, and a Missionary Society within it. Under him the numbers, the unity, the beneficence and the equipments of the school became second to none in Eastern Connecticut. He was quick to see and wise to guide the tokens of the Spirit in his classes. His hand prepared the interesting concert on the "Faith of Abraham,"

which was the last public exercise in the Old Church ere it was burned. Then the School met in the Huntington Street Baptist Lecture Room. There he organized a Cent Society by which they might aid in rebuilding the Church from its ashes. It seemed to the teachers a nightmare when they heard of his death. "The Lord will provide," were the words on his deathbed desk, which alone comforted the bereaved scholars. His two schools and his large class were mourners in the Church the afternoon when his pastor, Dr. Daggett, sketched the Christian character of their beloved leader gone.

Deacon William H. Chapman, previously Assistant Superintendent, succeeded Deacon Mayron. He did so reluctantly. But at the expiration of the year the teachers congratulated themselves and him on the *continued prosperity of the school and his entire success in his trying position.* At their urgent and unanimous request, Deacon Chapman accepted the post, being elected January 5th, 1877. Under his administration the large adult membership and the flourishing primary department are still cheering the friends of Christ. More than five hundred volumes have been added to the library the past year. The summer picnics and Christmas festivals are remembered with delight. The secretary, Mr. O. A. Mudge, reports a growing interest in the study of the Holy Scripture. Once every two months, on Sunday morning, the pastor has preached a sermon before the school from the pulpit. It now numbers forty teachers and four hundred and eleven members. A Teachers' meeting, conducted by a dozen teachers, each in their turn, is held Friday evenings. Eighty-seven members upheld the cause of freedom in our late war. Many more than that number have become freemen of Christ Jesus and enrolled themselves soldiers of the cross in the army of the Church.

Houses of Worship.

"The Lord loveth the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob." —*Psalm lxxxvii: 2.*

The first was a white wooden structure with a square belfry and four pillared portico, with a fine stone basement, built at a cost of \$12,000. It stood on the south corner of Huntington and Jay

Streets. Friday morning, March 13th, 1868, it was burned to the ground. Ten thousand dollars had just been expended in repairs. Rev. Mr. Wilcox preached to the homeless flock the next Sunday, March 15th, in the First Church, from the text, "Our holy and our beautiful house where our fathers praised thee is burned up with fire." Scraps of the scorched Bible and fragments of the old bell were guarded by the older members. The Sunday School recited Isaiah lxiv : 11 and 2 Cor. v : 1, during the sessions of a year. In this hour of trial the hospitality of the Universalist Society gave us a shelter which can never be forgotten.

The second and present edifice was begun by the laying of the corner-stone October 28th, 1868. Rev. Mr. Hurlbut, Elder Swan, Dr. Field, Dr. Smith of the building committee, and Rev. Mr. Wilcox took part in the public exercises. The Church was finished and dedicated June 1st, 1870. Rev. Dr. Arms read the scriptures, and Rev. Noah Porter, D. D., President of Yale College, preached the sermon from 2 Chronicles vi. The congregation rose to repeat a declaration in which they dedicated their souls, bodies and works to the Almighty Triune God. Mr. Wilcox made the prayer of dedication. An original dedication hymn was sung, beginning with the stanza,

God has a temple, built up strong and fair,
On holy ground ;
The stones are saints, and grace the quickening air
That flows around.

The concluding prayer was made by Rev. Joshua Coit, a son of the Church.

The Chapel was dedicated July 22d, 1870, with appropriate responsive readings and recitations, prayers and praises. The main address was by Deacon Haven, the superintendent.

The house thus built is of granite with a stone spire surmounted by a cross, with stained windows and horse-shoe galleries. The architects were Nichols & Brown, of Albany, N. Y. The building committee were Seth Smith, M. D., chairman, Robert Coit, Jr., Jonathan N. Harris, O. Woodworth, Richard H. Chapell, Freder-

rick H. Harris, A. G. Douglass, George Prest was the master-mason, and the late Timothy S. Daboll master joiner. The entire cost was \$140,000.

The first sermon preached in this beautiful edifice on the Lord's day was by Rev. Joshua Coit, from the words, "I was glad when they said unto me, let us go into the house of the Lord."

REVIVALS.

"They shall revive as the corn, and grow as the vine."—Hosea xiv 7.

This Church began with a special outpouring of the Spirit of God. The blessing of 1835 was succeeded by a greater blessing in 1836. The years 1842-43, under Mr. Boies were times of gracious refreshing. Under Dr. Edwards the Church enjoyed three such seasons of Divine manifestation, *i. e.*, in 1849, 1852 and 1856. During the interval between this and the subsequent pastorate the prayers and labors of the brethren were mightily owned of God and in May, 1858, thirty professed their faith in their Redeemer. In 1863, 1865 and 1867, in connection with the pungent preaching of Mr. Wilcox, aided by the evangelists Day and Potter, there were solemn and precious turnings of many unto the Lord. The same favor of the Almighty was on us again, as a dew from Heaven, in 1874, under Dr. Daggett's impressive preaching of the Prince of Life, and of Mr. Earls crowded and awakening evangelistic services in this city. Surely no Church may call with greater gratitude, humility and boldness on her covenant God and Savior, "O Lord revive thy work."

CHARITIES.

"All things come of Thee, and of Thine own have we given Thee."—1 Chron. xxix: 14.

The Church began with the gift of the land for the edifice by Hon. T. W. Williams. Of the \$12,000 expense of its erection, Rev. Mr. Hurlbut took three shares, Major Williams three, Dr. N. S. Perkins, Messrs. T. S. Perkins, Robert and Jonathan Coit, Ben-

jamin Brown, Ezra Chappell each one. Mr. Chappell, without designing to become a member of the organization, lent this generous helping hand to what he deemed a timely Christian undertaking. Unobtrusiveness, method and breadth have marked the Church's private and public charities. The idea of giving as a means of grace and an act of worship has been prominent. When the last \$12,000 on the Church debt was subscribed at the Society meeting, April 9th, 1878, it was done in five minutes time, "heartily as unto the Lord." That year, and for many previous, the average of contributions to the Gospel, at home and abroad, was between \$3,000 and \$6,000. Deacon H. P. Haven, by his presidency of the systematic beneficence society, his influence in the Sunday School, and now, after death, by his Trust Fund, deserves special mention among a host of the stewards of God's bounty in the Church. Premising that the sums unrecorded doubtless exceed rather than fall below those recorded, the following schedule is given of the Church Charities for the past ten years.

For this, as for other conscientious and efficient work on this manual, the Church is indebted to its Clerk of many years standing, Mr. O. A. Mudge, whose removal and retirement, by a change of residence, is universally regretted.

MINISTERS AND MISSIONARIES RAISED UP.

"For from you sounded out the word of life."—1 Thess. i: 8.

The Church began with a missionary aim and spirit. It sought to draw in persons not worshipping with any existing society. Gilead, Cohanzie and Town Hill were some of the points occupied. A Maternal Association was established by Mrs. Hurlbut, which was continued from January, 1833, for forty years. The love to Christ constraining such labors ran over and found utterance in the Young Men's Christian Association. There grew up sons and daughters burning for souls. Of these, eight have already entered the ministry of reconciliation at home. Two—Revs. John C. Middleton and Erastus C. Saunders—are rectors in the Episcopal Church. Six—Revs. Joseph Hurlbut, Jr., Joshua Coit, Thomas M. Boss, Daniel W. Fox, John Hurlbut and Charles H. Oliphant—have been or are preaching Christ in our own denomination. Two sisters, Miss Lizzie and Lottie Sisson, and one brother, Charles W. Kilbon, have told the story of the cross to the heathen of India and of Africa. Another, John Brown, son of one of the original founders, has been the captain of the "Morning Star" carrying light and life to the darkened isles of the Pacific. "The Henry Martyn Missionary Society of the Sunday School," the Sunday missionary labors of two of our Deacons, the work of several Brethren in visiting and quickening weak churches throughout the State, five Superintendents of other schools, are evidences and prophecies we trust that the Church is heeding, and will heed yet more abundantly, the command of her Glorious Head, "Go ye, therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost."
